# **Course Outcomes**



- Core Course 8 Political Process and institutions in comparative perspective to analyze the functioning of various institutions in a comparative manner.
- **Core Course 9 Public policy and Administration in India** the course intends to provide a detailed analysis about various public policies of government
- Core Course 10 Global Politics to examine the role of various international institutions including World Bank, World Trade Centre, United Nations etc.
- Core Course 11 Western Political Philosophy It teaches students about the core values of Individual freedom and limiting government power through separation of power, natural rights and limiting government.
- Core Course 12 Indian Political Thought : Ancient and medieval to study about the relevance of ancient and modern political thought in the modern world.
- DSE 1 Introduction to Human Rights the course is intended to highlight the concept of Human Rights, its evolution and importance in our society and to understand about various rights, including political, civil, social, economic and cultural rights.
- DSE 2 Development Process and Social Movements in Contemporary India to understand the dynamics of social conflicts, activism and social change and to familiarize contemporary social movements in the civil society with an emphasis on the movements by the marginalized sections in the era of neoliberal globalization

- **DSE -3 India's foreign policy in a changing world** intends to understand India's foreign policy as well its objective to maintain itself as a global leader.
- **DSE -4 Women, Power and Politics** describes the essential relations between women, power and politics and It offers a unique approach to understand the rights of women.
- **Generic Elective 1 Feminism** It examines various theories of different waves of feminism as well as the theoretical aspects to understand the problems of women.
- Generic Elective 2 Governance- Issues and Challenges to make an understanding about the difference between government and governance as well as different types of governance.
